St John of the Cross

On Thursday 14 December, we had the joy of celebrating the feast of St John of the Cross (1542-1591). He was recruited by St Teresa to become the first Teresian Carmelite friar in 1568. He was a spiritual director, mystic and poet. Because of his loyalty to St Teresa he spent nine months in a monastic prison in Toledo until he escaped. His writings are masterpieces of the Spanish language. His most famous image is the 'Dark Night of the Soul'. While it sounds depressing and forbidding it speaks of how we can be freed from the idols and addictions that control our lives. When we are freed from them we discover a new vitality, freedom and joy.

Final Report of the Royal Commission

On Friday, 15 December, the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse will complete its work. It will be up to the Federal Government when the final report is made public. However, this week the media have focused on the scandals. The damaged credibility of the Church because of child sexual abuse affects all Catholics. This is not an easy time. I think that it is a mistake to be defensive, to blame the media or cast doubt on the victims' motives. This 'dark night of the soul' is an invitation to become more the Church that the Lord calls us to be. Pope Francis (whose 81st birthday is this Sunday) inspires us by his words and actions to joy-filled, humble service of the Lord and of those who suffer.

Infant Jesus

The first title of our parish was St Paul's. Fr Hilary Doran changed it to "Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Infant, and his Virgin Mother Mary", (not the Infant Jesus of Prague). You can read the inscription, in Latin, on the 1960 corner-stone of the former parish church, now the parish centre. Fr Hilary gave the parish this title because of the devotion of Sts Teresa and John of the Cross to the Infant Jesus. Our shrine of the Infant Jesus being held by Mary with Sts Teresa and John of the Cross leading us to him illustrates our dedication. It has been understood that flowers were not to be put in front of this icon. This is a misunderstanding. So, I encourage everyone to visit the shrine and pray to the Infant Jesus, his Mother and the saints for our Church at this time. Flowers express our love and devotion. As long as they are not too big, or touch the icon, they are very suitable!


