THE WAY FORWARD - Reconciliation, Engagement and Enrichment The Archbishop's Announcement of his vision and priorities for the Archdiocese of Perth and Invitation to participate in the consultation process

In the homily at his Mass of Installation as the Archbishop of Perth in 2012, Archbishop Timothy Costelloe suggested that the greatest task and challenge we face today is to return the Church to Christ and return Christ to Church. 'The Way Forward' is the Archbishop's initiative, in which he identifies key areas of concern which he would like to address over the next three to five years, in the spirit of bringing God's people together in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd. These key areas are: ongoing focus on professional standards in relation to the terrible scourge of sexual abuse of children and young people, the need for effective communication within the Church and beyond the Church, to provide the best possible support to all clergy and to strengthen and revitalise our parishes and the renewal and expansion of our adult faith formation structures and program.






