

Dear parishioners,


Today sees the end of the Christmas season, with the celebration of the feast of the Baptism of the Lord and the Gospel today has three important things to say to us about ourselves. Jesus, the Son of God, born without sin, nevertheless accepted willingly the graces offered in the Sacrament of baptism. At our baptism, we received these same graces. Do we value our baptism? Secondly, we hear that Jesus "was at prayer after his baptism". Our baptism is pure gift, but having received this gift, we need to put in the necessary work to strengthen the graces we have received, through prayer, charity and good works. Lastly, in the Gospel, we hear that the heavens opened and God proclaimed Jesus as His beloved, His delight. If we share in Jesus' baptism, we also share in this belovedness, we also are the delight of our Father in heaven. Can we truly accept this?

We know that immediately after His baptism, Jesus began His short public ministry that only three years later saw Him die on the cross. Seen in this light, today's Gospel can reveal Jesus as a man preparing himself for the ordeal to come: taking in the graces He will need,

strengthening Himself in prayer and then clothing Himself in God's unconditional love. Only then does He begin the serious work of proclaiming the Kingdom. If we want to do our Father's will and share the Good News, we need to follow Jesus' example.

As the Christmas season ends, I would like to thank, once again, all those generous parishioners who contributed in any way to the preparation of the liturgies, the church and the grounds and also all who came to share in the celebrations.

It is also timely to remind you that the beginning of Lent is only four weeks away, with Ash Wednesday on the 13th February! - Fr. Sunny

YEAR OF FAITH—CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

In the Year of Faith, we have been asked to study the Catechism of the Catholic Church, where we discover WHY we do what we do. Such as:

I. The Desire for God

27 The desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself. Only in God will he find the truth and happiness he never stops searching for:

The dignity of man rests above all on the fact that he is called to communion with God. This invitation to converse with God is addressed to man as soon as he comes into being. For if man exists it is because God has created him through love, and through love continues to hold him in existence. He cannot live fully according to truth unless he freely acknowledges that love and entrusts himself to his creator.




