

Dear brothers and sisters,

Today we celebrate the feast of Christ the King of the Universe. Jesus proclaimed the reign of God in his preaching and asked people to believe in him and change their minds about their priorities. He was not like a king in the ancient world, or a modern despot for that matter, but one who set people free, lifted the burdens from their shoulders and gave the poor hope. He proclaimed we are all brothers and sisters called to have compassion for the most vulnerable and marginalised.

We come to Matthew's third 'parable' which seems to be about judgement but at a deeper level is about how we live now as we await the coming of the Lord. Matthew shares the common expectation of his time of a great final judgement to separate the worthy from the unworthy. There are only two possibilities life or damnation. This is a remote, stern and judgemental image of God. I think we need a more pastoral/caring/understanding /shepherd-like image of God. Which is what we find in both today's First Reading (Ez 34:11-12, 15-17) and the Gospel (Matt25:31-46).

The biblical scholar I rely on for these comments each week is Fr Brendan Byrne, SJ. He tells us that the translation of the First Reading from the Jerusalem Bible which reads 'I shall watch over the fat and the healthy' is more accurately read as "I will destroy..." (New Revised Standard Version). The 'fat sheep' have prospered at the expense of others in a time of great distress. Hence the conclusion 'I shall be a true shepherd to them' (JB) or more pointedly 'I shall shepherd them with justice.'(NRSV)

This sense of justice leads well into Matthew's account of the final judgment. The central figure is both 'shepherd' and 'king' or the 'shepherd-king'. The focus is not on the judgment itself but how one should behave given that we are accountable. The sole determinant is whether one has acted with active care and compassion toward people in need. This is what Jesus describes (Matt 23:23) as 'the weightier matters of the law': 'justice, mercy and faith' and the 'greatest commandment of the law': love of God and neighbour (Matt 22:36-40). Jesus is Immanuel, 'God with us', who so identifies with 'the least' of his 'brothers and sisters' that compassion shown or not shown to them is shown or not shown to him. There is no need to wait for the Son of Man to come in judgment; every time we encounter a fellow human being in need we stand before our Judge and King.

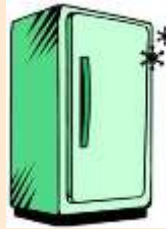
Lectio Divina Group

OPENING OF W.A BORDERS – WHAT IT MEANS FOR OUR PARISH

With the opening of our borders on 14 November, the need to revisit our commitment to the Phase 4 COVID-19 regulations is of paramount importance.



- While family groups will be able to sit together, a distance of 1.5 metres between a family group and the next person needs to be observed. Please follow the distancing measures on the pews.
- At communion time, please follow the floor measures and maintain a 1.5 metre distance between you and the nearest person.
- ALWAYS sanitise your hands as you enter the church.
- Observe the designated entrance and exit doors.
- After each WEEKDAY Mass and WEEKEND Mass, please assist in sanitising the church by spraying the pews with disinfectant. The bottles are kept in the flower room.
- The toilets need to be cleaned after each Mass by spraying with alcohol based disinfectant. Volunteer your help with this.
- Sanitise your hands whenever you visit the parish centre and follow the floor markings for appropriate distancing.
- If you are a group or ministry co-ordinator, ensure your group or ministry members are aware of the requirement to follow Phase 4 regulations.

Together, we can ensure that our worship space and community areas are safe places for our whole community, especially our very elderly and vulnerable community members. The opening of our borders will cause increased anxiety amongst many of our parishioners. Please help by doing everything you can to ensure that we are all safe.
