Dear brothers and sisters,

Today we begin five Sundays of readings from chapter six of John's Gospel. John 6 consists Jesus feeding a the large crowd with a few loaves and fishes (Jn 6:1-15), followed by a long discourse on the Bread of Life. The First Reading (2 Kings 2:42-44) recalls an event in the life of the prophet Elisha. He tells his servant to feed the crowd with the twenty barley loaves. As with the loaves and fishes in today's Gospel everyone is satisfied, there is plenty left over. When the Lord supplies, the generosity is unstinting.

The context for the feeding of the hungry people described in the Gospel (John 6:1-15) is the Jewish feast of Passover, a feast celebrating the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and their formation into the covenant people of God. For a hungry people Jesus himself is the 'Bread of Life'.

He takes responsibility for feeding them although the resources available are minimal. Jesus instructs the disciples to have the people sit down upon the green grass. The word translated 'sit down' has the sense of 'recline as if for a banquet'. For Jesus, it is not a question of 'buying' anything but rather of becoming instruments of the divine generosity. He takes the bread and fish that are available, blesses them and then shares them. Note we use the same verbs in our Eucharists. Our eucharistic celebrations through the ages continue Jesus' witness to the hospitality of God. Jesus invites people to share the food he provides as a sacrament of his own life. We have to be open to receive his gift.

In our Second reading (Eph 4: 1-6) Paul urges us to live with humility, gentleness and patience which build up the unity and peace of the Church and of the world. This is a call to live our Baptism fruitfully and united as one because we have one Lord, one Faith one Baptism. Faced with hunger on a global scale, the challenge of Jesus, 'Where can we buy bread for these people to eat?' remains. It is not just an economic or political question for Christians it also a religious question.
