Dear brothers and sisters,

Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary as a dogma of the Church in 1950. It celebrates the totality of Mary's union with God in Christ, her son. The feast also tells us that we are body and soul and that our life with God, even in heaven, is not as purely spiritual 'souls'. Having a body is a necessary part of being a fully redeemed human person. We see Mary as paradigm of the salvation to which all are called. It is then a feast of deep hope, warm love and radiant joy.

Today's Gospel (Lk 1:39-56) is a long reading that embraces both the Visitation and Mary's song- the Magnificat. Apart from Jesus himself, Mary is the central human figure in Luke's account of Jesus' infancy which highlights the quality and significance of her faith, prayer and openness to what God asks of her. Mary sings of the promised salvation God brings about by exalting the lowly (firstly herself) and putting down the mighty. Since God has chosen her to be mother of the Messiah then, in a key theme from Luke's Gospel, God reaches out in compassion to all the poor and lowly, rather than the rich and powerful.

By her faith and intimate care of Jesus after her death Mary already shares the fullness of salvation seen in the risen life of her Son, as proclaimed by Paul in the Second Reading, (1 Cor 15:20-26). Her risen life is a paradigm of what we are all called to share.

In the First Reading (Rev 11:19; 12:1-6,10) we are given the image of the Woman clothed with the sun, who gives birth to the Messiah. This applies in first instance to Israel and then to the Church, whose children share the victory of the Lamb. Christian tradition then applies the image of the fruitful woman to Mary.

The readings present Mary as a woman whose fidelity to Jesus models and prefigures the vocation of all believers. In Mary assumed into heaven we see a woman who was gifted with the fullness of eternal life. What begins by grace ends in the glory of God. By her complete self-giving to God's will and her intimate relationship with Jesus, Mary is gifted with the immediate fullness of the resurrection. In the glorified Mary we are given the promise of our own future.—*Blessings, Greg*


