

Dear brothers and sisters,

The Gospel today tells of Jesus healing a deaf man with a speech impediment (Mk 6:31-37). It deliberately links to our First Reading (Is 35:4-7). Jesus' act of healing fulfills the messianic promise. Typically, in Mark's Gospel Jesus performs this act of compassion in such a way as to attract as little attention as possible. Otherwise, the people would see him entirely in terms of their messianic expectations, which had a large political element bound up with it. He is not after power or popularity. His identity and mission will only be revealed by his suffering and death on the cross. Jesus who came 'not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many' (10:45).

Jesus does not use fancy mumbo jumbo or magic to heal but simply says 'Be Opened' (Ephphatha). How powerful is a healing word. The man's disabilities place him at a great disadvantage: he can neither receive verbal communication nor freely communicate his own thoughts, feelings and reflections to others. His condition is lonely and isolated. What Jesus does for this marginalised person is to bring him into the hearing and speaking community where interpersonal communication can truly flow.

Jesus was criticised for having meals with all sorts of unlikely characters, including tax collectors and public sinners. He was aware that they were people who needed help and not people to be avoided. James in the Second Reading (Jas 2: 1-5) warns us not to judge others and certainly not to favour those who are rich or powerful. To be honest who do we prefer to mix with? Our ears have been opened and our tongues are 'loosened' so that we can fully participate in the mission God gives us to bring healing and to set others free so that we may give thanks to God with unlikely others in the community of faith.


HE WHO SINGS, PRAYS TWICE
