

Dear brothers and sisters,

Next Sunday is the last of the Church's year. So, at this time the readings focus on endings: the end of the year, the end of an era, the end of our lives, the end of the world and the end of the Universe. The adjective for the end things is eschatological. Our First Reading today (Dn12:1-3) is eschatological and apocalyptic. It is set in the period of the Babylonian exile of the 6th Century BC but actually deals with the Hellenistic/ Maccabean uprising 400 years later when many Jews died because of their fidelity to God. So, the book of the Prophet Daniel is not history. However, it is the word of God and worth reading, albeit written by an unknown author.

Daniel tells the reader not to despair or think that the oppressive Hellenistic Empire and its imposed 'progressive' culture will triumph. Our reading today also contains the first clear reference in the Bible to the resurrection of the dead. Daniel affirms the need to trust in God who is with his people in dark times. The book of Revelation at the end of the 1st Century AD is also apocalyptic in encouraging Christians of that time to hang in there and trust in the ultimate triumph of God's faithful people against the Roman Empire. Apocalyptic literature is a distinctive genre, with visions and acts of God, which gives people hope. It does not try to frighten them with predictions of the imminent end of the world. It moves us to trust in God and live with hope.

This theme is also found in today's Gospel (Mark 13:24-32). Jesus foresees the 70AD destruction of the Temple and the city of Jerusalem, wars and turmoil on an international scale, the persecution of his followers with betrayal and even deceit within the community. Some of this has happened already and some is still happening today.

When all these calamities come upon us many are tempted to give up in despair. Why doesn't Jesus just return in his Second Coming and fix everything up in the final Reign/Kingdom of God? Instead, he urges us to remain faithful until he comes. Plus, the timing of his coming is known only to God. For believers things may seem overwhelming right now but we will not be overcome. The future belongs to God and what has ultimate value is the redemptive mystery of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus which is forever. Through our faith in Jesus, we will be victorious. He invites us to place our trust in him. He gives us hope in the darkest situations of our time or any time.—*Blessings, Greg*
