Dear brothers and sisters,

Today's **First Reading** (Mic 5:1-4) suggests Bethlehem is to be the place of the Messiah's birth. It points to what God has done in Christ: salvation coming from what is 'lowest' in human esteem. The messiah will be an unusual ruler- a 'shepherd' who will care for and feed his flock (cf. **Responsorial Psalm**). His rule will bring the 'peace', about which the angels sing to the shepherds (Lk 2:14). The **Second Reading** (Heb 10:5-10) stresses the superiority of Christ's offering of himself to the sacrificial ritual of the old covenant. What God wants from worshippers is not the sacrifice of animals but a commitment to do God's will. The life of Jesus, from Bethlehem to Calvary is a continuous gift of obedience offered for the salvation of the world.

In the **Gospel** (Luke 1:39-45) we have the meeting between Mary and her cousin, Elizabeth. The two pregnant women share their remarkable experiences. As their two stories come together, faith overflows in new insight, knowledge and celebration. Faith is first of all a journey during which we find signs that confirm what we believe. This is how Elizabeth's pregnancy functions for Mary. The conception of a child to parents of advanced years confirms Mary's faith that with God's Spirit replacing the role of male parent she is to become the mother of the messiah.

Mary's greeting to Elizabeth would have been 'Shalom' (peace, health, security and wellbeing). Mary brings the 'peace' of the messianic age. As soon as she utters this greeting, Elizabeth experiences the infant John within her womb leaping with joy. The Baptist is already exercising his role of pointing to the presence of the messiah. Hence Elizabeth confirms what Mary has believed: that she is indeed pregnant with the infant messiah whose role and destiny Gabriel had announced. She now has found the 'sign' that confirms her faith.

Elizabeth's proclaims that Mary is 'blessed' because of her faith: 'Blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.' Her faith was the channel through which salvation flowed into the world. Advent now comes into focus with the faith of Mary. Mary, the first Christian, is the faith prototype for all Christians. Such people of faith open up the world to God's creative and liberating power.

Advent prepares the way for us to celebrate the glorious mystery of Christmas. Every blessing to you and your family at this time from me, Fathers John and Tadgh and our wonderful parish staff and volunteers:
