Dear brothers and sisters,

In Matthew's Gospel the beautiful and inspiring Beatitudes are in the Sermon on the Mount. Today however, we hear the Lucan version of the Beatitudes (Lk 6:17, 20-26), from the Sermon on the Plain. In Luke there are 4 Beatitudes not 8 and we have 4 added woes. The tone is challenging and provocative. Jesus is speaking to his disciples while surrounded by many people seeking healing. He tells them that by adopting these values they too will become instruments of hope and healing for troubled people.

Being 'blessed' is not commending a moral attitude to be adopted. Rather it declares a person to be in a fortunate or advantageous position. It almost amounts to 'Congratulations!' in view of a coming action of God. Today's Beatitudes are not aspirational. We don't strive to be poor, hungry or sad, be still in God's favour if we are doing our best to follow Jesus in the midst of sadness, pain or misery. The First Reading (Jer 17:5-8) provides a background to this sense of being blessed or cursed based on whether we trust in God.

The Beatitudes and Woes are part of a major Lucan theme where the reign of God brings about a reversal of fortune. This is first expressed in Mary's Magnificat (Lk 1: 51-53):

He casts the mighty from their thrones and raises the lowly. He fills the starving with good things, sends the rich away empty. (Lk 1:51-53)

God is on the side of the poor and marginalised rather than the proud, rich and powerful. The Beatitudes call for a willingness to be vulnerable in the light of this understanding of God and God's faithfulness. The Christian community can become for the afflicted an instrument of God's power. Being vulnerable makes the world a safe place for humanity. 'The poor' are all whose emptiness and destitution provides scope for the generosity of God.

COVID 19 and Infant Jesus Parish

As you know following the current Governmental and Church directives we require that all priests and ministers in our parish be vaccinated. However, the requirements for those who attend mass are simple: when attending mass or any meeting on Church property you are required to wear a mask, to sign in or to use the SafeWA App and to sanitise your hands. These requirements are relatively simple and straightforward. Unfortunately, hand sanitiser has a corrosive effect on a metal sacred vessels. They are very expensive to repair. For this reason, we have therefore taken the temporary step of using glass bowls to hold the hosts for the distribution of holy communion. We pray that everyone is kept safe in these times. - *Blessing, Greg*
