Dear brothers and sisters,

In this Sunday's Gospel (Lk 13:1-9) Jesus is on his final journey to Jerusalem. The Gospel today references two incidents. The first is a massacre on orders from Pilate of a number of Galileans who were sacrificing in the Temple. The second is the fall of a tower in Siloam killing eighteen people. Jesus rejects the idea that the victims were being punished for sinfulness. He then tells a parable about the fig tree to make the point that God is always ready, patient, observant and ready to nurture. Jesus encourages us to continuously choose life, truth and love on our journey of life. If God's Spirit is in us then our mission is similarly to encourage others on their journey.

The First Reading, Ex (3:1-8, 13-15) describes the call of Moses to lead the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt. But God's identity remains in mystery: 'I am, who I am'. They will come to know God only as they commit to follow Moses in the highly risky project of their escape from slavery in Egypt. They will have to place their faith in Moses and in the unseen God who made and kept promises to their fathers, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. In today's Responsorial Psalm (Ps 102 /103) the people joyfully remember their history and express gratitude for God: The Lord is kind and merciful.

In the Second Reading (1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12) Paul warns the Corinthians not to presume that their profession of faith and their celebration of the sacraments automatically guarantee salvation. Conversion is a continual summons to align the reality of one's life with an ever-deepening knowledge of the God who spoke mysteriously to Moses and yet who 'became flesh' (Jn 1:14) in Jesus the Christ.

Lismore Floods Appeal

After masses this weekend we will have an opportunity to respond to Bishop Greg's appeal for those worst affected by the floods. Pope Francis has sent this message to Bishop Greg Homeming:

"Having learned of the loss of life and destruction of property caused by the heavy flooding in Lismore, his Holiness Pope Francis assures you of his heartfelt solidarity and closeness in prayer to all those affected by this tragedy. He prays especially for the repose of the deceased, the healing of those injured, and for the important work of reconstruction, commending all to the maternal intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, His Holiness cordially sends his blessing as a pledge of strength and peace in the Lord."
