Dear brothers and sisters,

Today's First Reading (2 Macc 7:1-2, 9-14) and the Gospel (Lk 20:27-38) both affirm life after death. Our first reading is made up of two excerpts from Chapter 7 of Second Maccabees but the whole chapter is worth reading. It tells the gripping story of a family who died for their Jewish faith around 150 years before Jesus. People of faith are prepared to surrender their lives because some values are so essential to human existence that they are worth dying for. Their noble sacrifice led people to come to believe that death is not the end and that there is an afterlife that is not just misery but includes a reward for integrity. At the time of Jesus Sadducees, the conservative Jews associated with the Temple priests in Jerusalem, refused to accept this development. For them there is no resurrection. The Pharisees on the other hand believed in a resurrection.

In today's Gospel the Sadducees use a crass assumption that life after death would simply be a repetition or extension of life in the present. For Jesus they fail to realise that the resurrection involves a form of existence that, while fully human, will completely transcend the conditions and limitations of present life on earth. Jesus also points out that they trivialise both the nature of God and the human relationship with God. The relationship God seeks to forge with human beings here and now is one that causes them to enter into God's own eternal being and so transcends death. Ultimately, then, denial of the resurrection is a denial of God as the Judeo-Christian tradition conceives God to be.

Here are some clarifications by Thomas O'Loughlin regarding resurrection: Resurrection is communal not individual, it is transformation not resuscitation it is embodied life in God not the spiritual endurance of the soul it is God's gift, not an innate quality of immortality of the soul.

Heart of the Disciple—A 28-day reflection resource for Advent or any time during the 2022-2023 liturgical year. In the way that John the Baptist announced the coming of something new, so giving people hope and offering them healing, we are to live lives that inspire others to reach out to God. 
