Dear brothers and sisters,

Today's readings feature the 'Shepherd' image which goes back to King David who was a young shepherd before being anointed as king(1 Sam 16:11-13). Rather than lording it over their people Israel's kings were meant to be shepherds for the people. Few kings lived up to the ideal, but the Messiah, the Son of David, was to be the 'Good Shepherd'. Chapter 10 of John's Gospel elaborates this theme in relation to Jesus. The words of Jesus are very moving: 'I am the Good Shepherd' (v 11). Today's Gospel (In 10:1-10) develops this theme.

While we have lots of sheep in Australia, we now have few shepherds. Sheep in the time of Jesus grazed during the day on open hillsides under the watchful eye of the shepherd. At dusk they were taken for the night to large communal sheepfolds with one watchman looking after the mingled flocks. At daybreak the shepherds returned, and each called his sheep out. Recognising his voice, the sheep would follow their shepherd to the pastures. Sheep would not follow a stranger. Thieves could climb over the walls during the night to steal sheep, never going in through the

Sheep in very large modern flocks are notoriously stupid. Friends of mine with sheep tell me that in small flocks sheep are actually very resourceful. There must be a right size, not too big and not too small for a flock to flourish. It is such small flocks that Jesus uses for his image of the close mutual knowledge between sheep and shepherd. The shepherd knows his sheep. So too his sheep know his voice, trust him and so follow him. The shepherd knows, cares for, and protects his sheep. As it is for Jesus, so it is for those who lead his flock (family/congregation/ community) today: we are called to know, love, care for and protect the flock entrusted to us.

Jesus also uses the image of the gate of the sheepfold: 'I am the Gate of the sheepfold.' If sheep are to flourish, they have to come and go through the gate of the fold; if they stay within the fold, their condition will deteriorate for lack of fresh pasture. If they do not return to the sheepfold they are at greater risk. So, the gate is necessary for both the flock's protection and growth.

It is only through lively, om-going interaction with Jesus will we find life and growth. Our Gospel today concludes 'I have come that they may have life and have it to the full', (v. 10). That is more than mere existence but is 'eternal life'. That is, a share in the undying life of God. —Blessings, Greg


