Dear brothers and sisters,

What do we do when there are disagreements and tension in the church? First thing to say that it isn't surprising that there are inevitably different points of view. In today's **First Reading** (Acts 6: 1-7) we can see how the early church responded to a difficult situation. Those who were Gentiles and spoke Greek had a grievance against the Jewish Aramaic speakers: they felt they were being overlooked in the daily distribution (of food and/or ministries). So, they brought their situation to the leaders who called a meeting of the whole community (a synod) to work out what to do. What happened was that under the guidance of the Holy Spirit a new ministry, that of deacons, was instituted in the church.

Pope Francis is calling the Church now to live this spirit of synodality today by travelling together, speaking honestly, listening carefully to peoples' experiences and discerning what God is asking of the church now. In <u>Fratelli</u> <u>Tutti</u>, he tells us, "When conflicts are not resolved but kept hidden ... silence can lead to complicity in grave misdeeds and sins. Authentic reconciliation does not flee from conflict, but is achieved in conflict, resolving it through dialogue and open, honest and patient negotiation."

Today's **Gospel** (Jn 14: 1-12) is taken from John's long farewell discourse (Jn 14- 17). Jesus is preparing the disciples for his death but also for his not being physically present throughout history. John's Gospel presents the entire life, death and resurrection of Jesus as a single unified divine project to bring about mutual at-homeness between God and humanity and between people. His going away is not a loss but opens up a graced time. It is through the Spirit an enrichment. So, Jesus says: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled...' And to Martha, the sister of Lazarus, 'I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even though they die will live; and whoever lives believing in me will never die' (Jn 11. 25-26).

Initial Results from our Survey

Thanks to all who filled in our recent survey on our understanding of the Eucharist. The response was excellent: we received 552 responses of whom 46 were from visitors. It will take us some time to properly to digest all the responses. However, in the question on the presence of Christ in the mass 80% identified Christ as being present in the proclamation of the word of God, the person of the priest, the consecrated bread and wine and in the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. This is very encouraging as it faithfully reflects the Church's theology of the Eucharistic celebration.
