Dear brothers and sisters,

All of us live by stories which embody our beliefs and values. In today's Gospel Jesus rebukes Peter who has just been praised for identifying Jesus' true identity ("You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God"). Jesus now rebukes him and calls him Satan! Peter is so stuck in the story of power as success over others that he cannot cope with the thought that Jesus must die and to all appearances be a failure. In stories of power and success there are winners and losers. What Peter fails to understand is that Jesus lives by a different story- the story of self-sacrificing love where everyone is welcome and everyone is a winner. The political and religious rightly saw Jesus' new story of love as a threat to their power and domination.

So, the missions of Jesus in the Gospel (Mat 16:21-27) and Jeremiah in the First Reading (Jer, 20:7-9) are met with incomprehension and violent rejection. Jeremiah's painful destiny is to prophesy the coming of 'violence and ruin' to a people who, understandably, wanted a more positive message. Jeremiah resists his prophetic duty by simply remaining silent. But there is no escape from his vocation to speak the truth.

Jesus accepts the cross because of his love and his fidelity to his divine mission. He invites al who would follow him to take up their own cross and lose their life in order to find true life. Both Peter's and Jeremiah's complaints in today's readings may find an echo in our daily struggle to go with Jesus along the costly way of love. Peter fails to understand that new story of love shown in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus is the end of the old story of peace through violence and domination.

The way of the cross is not the way of the world of consumption and accumulation, nor of violence and domination nor is it the glorification of suffering and victimhood. It is the way of costly service, healing and reconciliation that excludes no one. There are no First Class or Second and Third Class Catholics. We are all equal, all loved. The Church has room for everyone. Everyone. So, we are called to hear the voices of those who are different from us and to invite all to share the table of abundant divine gifts given in the death and resurrection of the Lord. It is the story of shared Life without limits. It is religious but has, as shown in Catholic Social Teaching and the Magisterium, of Pope Francis, personal, social, economic and political consequences.


