Dear brothers and sisters,

Today's readings give responsibility that members of a community have for the spiritual and moral wellbeing of others. Sadly, however, religious history has many sobering examples of power and violence used to establish and control righteousness.

The **First Reading** (Ez 33:7-9), the prophet's overall aim in correcting others is to bring the wrongdoer to life, rather than to punishment or death.

The **Gospel** (Matt 18:15-20) is part of the discourse of Jesus on the life of the Church community. The Church is not a community of the perfect. How then do we deal with moral lapses, dissension and other disturbances that occur in any community 'on the way' to the Kingdom. The procedures set out here reflect Old Testament models requiring two witnesses.

The first step is to sort out a problem in private. If that proves unsuccessful there is a graded progression of increasingly public procedures, designed to preserve the dignity of the errant person. 'Going public', so to speak, is a last resort. The goal is not to win, but to 'win back your brother or sister'. The goal is to find a way that will enhance everyone's sense of being a respected and valued member of the 'family'. There comes a time beyond when the community acts decisively against members who consistently defy its core values. This is not a trivial matter. The Lord promised to be with the Church in its on-going challenges and development through his Spirit.

In the **Second Reading** (Rom 13:8-10) Paul teaches us that our redemption from sin and death which God's love has won for us in Christ has created an inexhaustible 'debt' of love. God wants us to repay that debt by considering that we owe to our sisters and brothers with all their flaws.

You, therefore, almighty Father, we bless through Jesus Christ your Son, who comes in your name. He himself is the Word that brings salvation, the hand you extend to sinners, the way by which your peace is offered to us. When we ourselves had turned away from you on account of our sins, you brought us back to be reconciled, O Lord, so that, converted at last to you, we might love one another through your Son.
