Dear brothers and sisters,

The **First Reading,** from Ezekiel 18:25-28, makes 2 important points: individual responsibility (no one is punished for wrongdoing they did not commit); conversion turns a person's life completely to the positive outcome that God longs to bring about. The parable in today's Gospel (Matt 21:28-32) depicts how God waits with infinite patience for the final outcome in people's lives. God can put up with an initial 'No' and lots of other 'No's' on the way to a final and lasting 'Yes'. But people who appear religious may never experience the depth of God's mercy and so do not know God as God really is. Conversion gives us the capacity to say 'Yes' with a freedom that overflows into a pattern of life truly reflective of God's grace. A judgmental attitude indicates a lack of any real knowledge of God.

The **Second Reading** from (Phil 2:1-11) is one of the great treasures of the New Testament: a very early 'Christ-Hymn' that Paul quotes in order to remind the community in Philippi that the heart of good community relations is a sharing of the 'mind' (attitude) of Christ's self-emptying love in an 'obedience unto death', even to death on the cross. This is what being 'in a divine state', being 'equal to God', means.

Flowing from this I commend these words from Bishop Vincent Long's Pastoral Letter on the Referendum: "I believe that just as a YES vote to the Referendum in 1967 (which recognised First Nations People as part of the Australian population) was, a heart-felt YES to the Voice is a YES to a better future for Australia. Indeed, a more civilised and gracious response to a history littered with violence is hard to imagine. For despite much progress since European settlement, we must redress the near destruction of our First Peoples' ancient spirituality and culture. The Church was regrettably complicit in this." I doubt if many people have followed the Australian's bishops request to actually read the "Uluru Statement from the Heart". No matter what the outcome of the referendum, I, too, recommend reading it. *—Blessings, Greg*

Come, Holy Spirit, soul of the Church: gather into unity and make fruitful the toil, the hope, and the desire of each one involved in the Synod Assembly. Come, God's Forgiveness, and convert us into your breath that reconciles us for a new fellowship. Come, unapproachable Wisdom, and fill us with your synodal gifts. Come unfailing, Hope of the Church, and stir up dreams and desires according to the heart of God, which to the, to the human eye, seem impossible. *Universal Prayer Intercession*
