Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's Scripture readings are quite political. In today's **First Reading** (Is 45:1, 4-6) Cyrus of Persia, a non-Israelite ruler is portrayed as God's chosen instrument for the liberation of Israel from exile in Babylon. The positive portrayal of Cyrus paves the way for today's Gospel.

In the **Gospel** (Matt 22:15-21) the hot political issue regarding paying tax to the Roman Emperor is put to Jesus. Jesus has entered Jerusalem as its messianic king when he is confronted by people who, under the overall control of the Romans, wield authority in the city. They perceive the political threat posed by Jesus to their hold upon the people and so seek to bring him down. So, they want to portray him as dangerous to the Romans. If he supports the payment of the highly unpopular poll tax, he will lose standing with the people. If he rejects payment, he runs the risk of being identified with terrorist groups in rebellion against Rome, and so being shown as a significant threat to peace and wellbeing.

Jesus calls for them to produce a coin with Caesar's image on it thereby showing up his opponents as people who carry around the offensive coinage, something he doesn't do. They are revealed as collaborators whereas his own position is not disclosed. Jesus then takes possession of the religious and moral high ground by setting responsibility to the civil power (which he does not deny) within the higher framework of obedience to God. The Christian sense that believers have responsibility before God in both realms has its origins here. Politics were an inescapable part of Jesus' life and, indeed, of our own lives today.

## After the Referendum

In his most recent Letter from Rome, Archbishop Tim Costelloe wrote to us: "there will be some who are rejoicing and some who are lamenting. Because of this, I want to remind us all that as Catholics we are called to be creators of communion, not of dissension and disharmony. I hope that we can all work together to ensure that our indigenous sisters and brothers are supported, welcomed and valued in our communities. How can we be "a sign of the unity of all humanity" if we fail in this challenge?"

I have already received one suggestion in line with what the Archbishop suggests from a parishioner. I welcome any further suggestions. We'll take time to discern what we can do locally.
