Dear sisters and brothers,

Our readings explore the unity between the love of God and love of neighbour: the very heart of Christian religion. These two commandments from the Old Testament (Deut 6:4-5 and Lev 19:18) were brought together by Jesus. He drew directly on the tradition of his people that all commandments are within the covenant commitment to God. The **First Reading** (Ex 22:20-26) counsels compassion for the vulnerable: 'the widow, the orphan and the stranger in the land'. These people lacked family protection and so were exposed to ill-treatment and exploitation. The Lord reminds the Israelites that they were once oppressed in Egypt until God heard their cries and rescued them. The Lord hears the cries of the vulnerable. God is on the side of the poor and disadvantaged.

The teaching of Jesus in today's **Gospel** (Matt 22:34-40) continue that tradition. The question about the chief commandment is another hostile attempt to shame Jesus. Jesus has no hesitation in uniting two commandments concerning love. The second commandment is 'like' the first in the sense that it flows immediately from the nature of God. In the **Second Reading** (1 Thess 1:5-10) Paul reminds the community how gifted they are, how richly blessed by God. We have much to contribute if our love of God overflows in active compassion for the oppressed and needy.

In this we have the example of Jesus himself who "always showed compassion for children and for the poor, for the sick and for sinners, and he became a neighbour to the oppressed and the afflicted" ... So we pray "Open our eyes to the needs of our brothers and sisters; inspire in us words and actions to comfort those who labour and are burdened. Make us serve them truly, after the example of Christ and at his command. And may your Church stand as a living witness to truth and freedom, to peace and justice, that all people may be raised up to a new hope." (Both quotes are from Eucharistic Prayer IV for Various Needs).
