

# Happy Christmas to all!

Today we celebrate the joy of God becoming human (the Incarnation). I will share some thoughts with you on the readings from midnight mass (Is 9:1-6, Ps 96, Titus 2:11-14 and Lk 2:1-14). We live today in a world where violence, war and the lack of human respect are all around us. Isaiah portrayed his own times during the exile as people walking in darkness and dwelling in a land of gloom, people who suffered under the rod of an overseer, people who ceased to matter. Similarly, there was little of prosperity or joy while Mary and Joseph trudged along the 90 miles that separated Nazareth from Bethlehem. The census that put them on the road symbolizes the people's subjugation to a pagan empire. That there is no room at the inn symbolises rejection even by the Lord's own.

Jesus was born in desperate circumstances. His parents, like the 100 million people today forced to be on the move amid ever-present difficulties and danger, travelling hopefully trusting, in the kindness of strangers. Mary and Joseph and the child they were about to receive into the world are icons of God. The Creator did not exercise overwhelming power by intervening in human situations, but through divine love becoming flesh and blood he invites people to respond to his love with generous, open hearts. God acted in this way to bring joy to the needy.

Who did notice and respond? The most unlikely characters, shepherds. Shepherds were men of shady reputation, unwashed and outside the religious laws. They took the angels' message to heart. They left their 99 (more or less) sheep and hastened to Bethlehem to see "what the Lord has made known to us." Then the shepherds became the first evangelists, "glorifying God and making known the message."

For Christians, the Incarnation is the high point of creation, the most concrete expression of divine love and our clearest image of what God is like. The joy of Christmas is that God loves us enough to share our human life. God has become vulnerable to us, never imposing but graciously inviting us to a fruitful communion possible only because God enters into human life in all its complexity. All of this is to invite us to become more like God, to embody his love and bring joy to the vulnerable and needy of our time.

## WHY WE GIVE AND HOW OUR MONEY IS USED - THE FIRST COLLECTION

Since the earliest days of the church, the Christian community has accepted the responsibility of supporting those who are charged with taking the Gospel to the world. When Jesus commissioned his



Apostles to go out and share the Good News, he said, "When you travel, don't take a walking stick. Also, don't carry a bag, food, or money. Take for your trip only the clothes you are wearing. When you go into a house, stay there until it is time to leave." Lk 9:3-4. In other words, they were commissioned to trust in the generosity of the community for their daily needs. And in 1Timothy 5:18, we hear "the labourer deserves to be paid." In giving to the first collection at Mass, we are continuing this responsibility of supporting our priests so they can continue their mission of sharing the Good News in the Morley area.

When the Carmelite friars were invited to take responsibility for the Parish of Infant Jesus in 1955 by the Archbishop of Perth, they accepted financial responsibility for the parish as well. Unlike Diocesan priests, our Discalced Carmelite Order priests receive no financial support from anyone but us—the parishioners of Morley. The money received in the first collection, therefore, needs to cover all their living expenses; food, clothing, cars, petrol, maintenance, household & medical expenses — in other words everything needed for their work and daily life.

With prices rising and the First Collection decreasing in recent years, we need to recall Christ's confidence in the people of his Church — that they will care for his Apostles and Evangelists so that they can focus on carrying out his mission in the world.
