Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's readings are a timely examination of conscience as we prepare to begin Lent. The first reading and the Gospel today show divine power confronting one of the most dreaded of human ills: leprosy. The First Reading (Lev 13:1-2, 45-46) is part of a long list of prescriptions concerning skin diseases. The biblical legislation does not deal with leprosy as we know it today. The sufferer is seen as unclean and condemned to a living death isolated from family and community. Today's Gospel (Mk 1:40-45) shows Jesus' encounter with a leper.


The leper is supposed to shout "Unclean" to warn people to avoid him, but he approaches and challenges Jesus, 'If you want to, you can make me clean', is already a strong act of faith in the power and indeed the status of Jesus. Approaching Jesus, the leper believes, he can raise him from the dead by the life-giving power of God. Jesus is moved to his guts (in the Greek original: splangchnistheis) by the man's plea.

By touching the leper Jesus smashes the clean/unclean barrier in all its physical, social, moral, and religious dimensions. He unmasks the whole system itself as "unclean" not the afflicted leper. Jesus embodies the divine compassion reaching out to touch and accept afflicted humanity.

'Uncleanness' or 'unholiness' is then a spiritual or moral condition not just a physical ailment. It has to do with the heart. True 'cleanness' or 'holiness' is something human beings catch by coming close to God, which is precisely what this man has achieved by having the faith, in his condition, to approach Jesus. Who are today's lepers? We are called to fast from judgement and rejection of others. Who do we categorise as losers, unclean, unworthy and sinful?

Be imitators of Christ. Imitate the one who responded first to the marginalised, to society's outcasts, to the ones who make us feel threatened and uncomfortable. How are we to imitate Christ today?

Ash Wednesday, the first day of the season of Lent, and Good Friday are the only two days designated by the Church as days of fast and abstinence.

In current Catholic practice, fasting means having only one full meal a day. Smaller quantities of food may be eaten at two other meals but no food should be consumed at any other time during the day. The law of fasting applies to people from 18 to 59 years old. Abstinence is the practice of abstaining from the use of certain kinds of food. Everyone aged 14 years and older is bound by the law of abstinence from meat.

The practice of fasting and abstinence aims at leading us to interior conversion by making us more disciplined and more charitable. We fast in order to share our time and our treasure with an attitude of love towards God and others. In addition, the practice helps us imitate the example of Jesus who fasted for 40 days in the desert. (sourced from Liturgy Lines by Elizabeth Harrington 2016)
