

Dear sisters and brothers,

In the midst of the sorrows and losses of life, we rejoice at the resurrection of Jesus and the life, hope and joy he brings. The **Easter Gospel** (Jn 20:1-9) shows the confusion and chaos of the disciples when they discover that Jesus' body is missing from his tomb. Mary Magdalen is the first to make this disturbing discovery. She thinks that grave robbers have committed the final, shameful indignity by stealing his body. There is a sense of despair, emptiness and loss. Later she will meet the risen Lord and be commissioned to be 'the apostle to the apostles', the first one chosen to announce that Jesus had risen from the dead.

Hearing Mary's testimony Peter and the unnamed 'disciple Jesus loved' set out to verify the facts. The disciple arrives first, bends low and sees the linen cloths which wrapped the body of Jesus lying on the ground. Peter goes into the tomb. He sees the neatly rolled up cloth that covered Jesus' face in a place by itself.

When the 'disciple Jesus loved' then enters the tomb he realises that Jesus' body was not taken by grave robbers. Thieves don't neatly fold up the things they leave behind. The disciple saw and recalled the words of Jesus 'I am the Resurrection and the Life' (11:25) and his words that he had the 'power to lay down his life and to take it up again' (10:18). He 'believes' in the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. We may not speak with, see or touch the risen Lord as did Mary Magdalene, Peter or Thomas. Yet, we too, as beloved disciples, believe in God's power to bring life out of death.

The **First Reading** (Acts 10:34, 37-43) gives an account of the sermon Peter preached in the house of the pagan Roman centurion Cornelius. It is the heart of the gospel. There are two conversions in this account: that of Cornelius to faith in Christ and that of Peter. Peter is converted when he realises that Jesus excludes no one. The Lord's embrace of all people overcomes the alienation of this world. Pope Francis continually invites us to be embrace others who are different from us as Jesus did and so to bring them the love and blessing of God.

In the **Second Reading** (Col 3:1-4) Paul reminds us that even now through baptism we share in the risen life of the Lord. Christ's triumph over sin and death lightens our journey of life with hope and joy.

Today's **Collect Prayer** expresses this faith: "O God, who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray, that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life."

The Resurrection is not an historical event in the past. Christ's defeat of death is a present reality even in our time. Sin and death will never have the last word. Risen life displaces death through the waters of Baptism. This is an ongoing work in each of us through the power of the Spirit who is the gift of the resurrected Lord to the church (In 20:22).

So, today, we sing with joy: Christ has risen, Alleluia! He has truly risen! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

### PARISH COLUMBARIUM \*

Our columbarium currently has both double and single niches, which are able to hold the ashes of one or two people. The Columbarium also incorporates niches and a memorial garden for babies and children in the St. Therese Childrens' Garden.



#### ▶ IMPORTANT CHANGES TO NOTE

Due to the unexpected demand for niches in our columbarium, the committee, with approval of Fr. Greg, have updated the Columbarium General Conditions with regard to who may apply for a niche and who may be interred in the columbarium.

#### These new conditions will take effect from MONDAY 29TH APRIL, 2024.

#### After this date, those who may apply for a niche are:

- A current or former parishioner who wishes to apply on behalf of a spouse or partner or dependent child who is deceased.
- A current or former parishioner aged 65 years or older who wishes to reserve a niche in advance for themselves, their spouse or partner; and/or
- A current or former parishioner who is terminally ill and wishes to reserve a niche in advance for themself.

Similarly, after this date, those whose ashes may be interred in the columbarium are:

- ♦ A current parishioner or a former parishioner approved by the committee;
- ♦ A current or former parishioner and their spouse or partner; and/or
- ♦ A parishioner's dependent child, including a child by adoption or who is a member of the parishioner's step-family, or other non-dependent children as approved by the committee.

Any applications prior to 29th April, 2024, will be covered by the current General Conditions. If you have any concerns or queries regarding these changes, please contact the Columbarium Committee at columbarium @infantjesusparish.org.au.

If you would like to make an appointment to submit an application or discuss the changes to the General Conditions, please phone the parish office on 9276 8500 and one of the committee will be in touch. Also, a member of the committee is always available on Monday between 9.30am and 11.00am.
