SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY 2014 - 2015

We celebrate Social Justice this Sunday, 28 September. This year's Social Justice Statement is titled: 'A Crown for Australia: Striving for the best in our sporting nation'.

The Statement celebrates the place of sport in our national life, especially the way in which it brings individuals and communities together and contributes to our health and wellbeing. At the same time, the Statement challenges us to look at sport's darker side - the potential for violence, abuse and corruption that blemish its image and disillusions those who love it most.

Pope Francis says: ".....during the game, when you are out on the pitch, you display beauty, generosity and camaraderie. If a match lacks these qualities it loses force, even if the team wins. There is no room for the individualism; team coordination is paramount.....it is true that national and international organisations professionalise sport, and it should be this way. But this professional dimension must never push aside the initial vocation of an athlete or team: be amateurs. When an athlete, even a professional one, cultivate this dimension of being an 'amateur', society benefits and that person strengthens the common good with the values of generosity, camaraderie and beauty".
