Dear brothers and sisters.

In this week's Gospel, (In 1:6-8, 19-28), as in last week's, we focus on John the Baptist. The Baptist is asked by those who think they have a monopoly of authority what is his authority for calling people to repentance, who is he? Why is he doing what he is doing? His answers are mostly negative. Unlike celebrities he points beyond himself to a mysterious stranger unrecognised in their midst. He is simply a voice in the wilderness making a way for the Lord. John's calling is that of all the saints who point us to Christ. His calling is our calling, as well. In John's Gospel Jesus is the 'light of the world' (Jn 1:4-5). In the person of Jesus, and in his words and deeds, we see the conquest of darkness by light that marked the very first act of God in creation (Gen 1:3-5). Wherever Jesus speaks or performs healing acts ('signs') light overcomes darkness and communicates to human beings God's gift of eternal life.

The First Reading (Is 61:1-2, 6-11) with its rich reflections upon the notion of 'gospel', invites us to think of all the various 'captivities' – personal, social, moral and economic – in which we labour and from which we long for liberation. The liberation proclaimed by the Gospel is essentially spiritual at its core. However, the Church today insists spiritual liberation cannot be divorced from the requirements of social and economic justice. The Good News is a call to both freedom and conversion.

Paul in the Second Reading (1 Thess 5:16-24) tells us: "Be happy at all times". Our faith in Christ born in Bethlehem calls us to joy. In the midst of the often painful realities of life we have the gift of joy and peace. Paul also tells us: 'Do not quench the Spirit', as one 'quenches' the flame of a candle or lamp. Prophecy is an essential gift from God to the community of faith. It is the ability to discern the action of God beneath the ordinary run of things. It is not to be despised. It does, however, need to be 'tested'. The standard of prophecy is its effect upon the community: whether that be 'fruitful' or 'discouraging'.

The entrance antiphon of the Third Sunday of Advent centres on the call to be joyful. "Rejoice in the Lord always! Again, I say, rejoice. The Lord is near" (Phil 4:4-5). So we pray in the Collect of today's mass: "enable us to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing."

Reconciliation as we come together to listen and reflect on the Word of God; to express our sorrow for the times we have failed and to praise our God, whose forgiveness is unfailing.


The second form of the sacrament of penance is a communal liturgical celebration from beginning to end. It begins with the community listening to the word of God. The homily emphasises our need for repentance and the infinite mercy of God. During the examination of conscience, the assembly reflects together on where and how they have fallen short of their baptismal commitment to follow Christ. The individual confession and absolution that follows is communal too in that the penitents approach the confessors in full view of all present.

The priests sit at appropriate points around the worship space in such a way that penitents can be seen but not heard by others. This is easily arranged in most churches. Those who wish to confess their sins approach one of the priests. While no restriction is placed on the individual's confession, good manners and common sense dictate that people limit the time they spend with confessors. More time for integral confession and spiritual guidance is available at the first rite.

It is a moving experience to witness fellow Christians humbling themselves by publicly approaching a confessor for forgiveness. As they do, we pray for them, that they will know the fullness of God's grace and mercy.
